Some Additional Details

- Airfare is an estimate based on previous years' cost.

- You may use frequent flyer points or upgrade your seats.
- Required: Proof of COVID vaccination and a negative PCR test within 72 hours of arrival.
- Required: Premium trip insurance is provided through Faith Ventures.
- Required by Har-El Travels: Cancel for any reason trip insurance.
- Most tour days are 8 a.m. until 6 p.m. or later. Some days may include walking 5-8 miles on uneven terrain at varying elevations. Some of the sites are not handicap accessible.

Thursday, February 23 - Depart Charlotte

Friday, February 24 - Welcome to Israel

Arrive Tel Aviv. Meet your guide at Passport Control and proceed to the bus for your transfer to your hotel in Tel Aviv.

Overnight - Tal Hotel, Tel Aviv. D

Saturday - February 25 - From Jaffa to Galilee

Begin the day in **Jaffa** (Joppa), one of the oldest biblical cities. Travel up the coast to **Caesarea** built by King Herod the Great and once the seat of Roman rule. Head to **Megiddo**, an important site dating back to the times of the Canaanites and once-lovely palaces of the Israelite Kings.

Overnight - Ginossar Hotel, Galilee. B, D

Sunday, February 26 - The Cradle of Christianity

View wooden fishing boat from early 1st century next to our Kibbutz. Sail around

the **Sea of Galilee** and visit the **Church of the Beatitudes**, traditional site of the "Sermon on the Mount." Proceed to **Tabgha**, the traditional site of the "Feeding of the Multitudes," and then to see where Jesus transferred the Primacy of the church to Peter. In **Capernaum**, view the remains of the large white limestone synagogue and the center of Jesus' Ministry in the Galilee. Continue to the **Dan Nature Reserve**, one of the sources of the Jordan River. Then, atop the **Golan** to the summit of **Mount Bental**, a volcano, and take in a superb view of the Israeli–Syrian lines. Hear of the battles and the history that have taken place between Israel and Syria from 1948 to date. Dinner at Magdelena Restaurant (own account). **Overnight – Nof Ginosar Hotel, Galilee. B**

Monday, February 27 - The Hills of the Galilee

On to **Canna** where it is said Jesus turned water into wine at a wedding feast. Then proceed to **Nazareth**, where Jesus spent his childhood. View the **Basilica of the Annunciation**, commemorating the spring where the Angel Gabriel appeared to Mary. Visit the **Church of St. Joseph** known as the "Workshop of Joseph." Visit **Magdala**, a true crossroads of Jewish and Christian history. It is believed that Jesus encountered Mary of Magdala here.

Overnight - Ginossar Hotel, Galilee. B, D

Tuesday, February 28 - Along the Jordan Valley to Jerusalem

Check out of hotel and drive to **Mt. Tabor**, the traditional site of the Transfiguration. View the fertile **Jezreel Valley**. Arrive at **Kasser El Yahud**, "the Jews Passage," the traditional site of the Israelites' crossing the Jordan River into the Promised Land and place John the Baptist baptized Jesus. Ascend to **Jerusalem**. Upon your first view of the eternal Holy City, stop for a brief service of communion on the **Mount of Olives**

Wednesday, March 1 - The Old City of Jerusalem

Enter the Old City via the **Jaffa Gate**. Walk over to the **Western Wall and Western Wall Tunnels** for a tour of the archaeological discoveries excavated in a vast concealed tunnel along the Western Wall. Walk through the **Christian Quarter** along the **Via Dolorosa** and the **Stations of the Cross** to the **Church of the Holy Sepulchre**, the crucifixion and burial place of Jesus. After lunch in the Old City, walk to the **City of David**, just outside of the walls of the Old City, the site of Biblical Jerusalem, and the capital of King David. Walk through the 3,400 year old Canaanite **dry tunnel** (or bring a change of clothing and explore a King Hezekiah's water tunnel engineered some 2,700 years ago) ending at the **Southern Wall Excavations**

Overnight - Herbert Samuel Hotel, Jerusalem. B

Thursday, March 2 - Mount of Olives and Old City of Jerusalem

Begin on the **Mount of Olives**, with a beautiful view of Jerusalem. Visit the Chapel of the Ascension, the Church of Pater Noster at which the Lord's Prayer is written in 53 languages. Continue to the **Dominus Flavit Church** where it is said Jesus wept over Jerusalem. Visit the **Garden of Gethsemane** at the foot of the Mount of Olives and the magnificent **Church of** all Nations (Basilica of Agony). Celebrate Communion led by Rev. Peery in a private garden. Visit the Garden Tomb, an ancient lewish sepulchre that matches the New Testament description of the tomb in which lesus was buried. Tour the lewish Quarter, Cardo, Mt. Zion, and King David's tomb above which is the Room of the Last Supper, traditional site of the Last Supper and the visitation of the Holy Spirit a Pentecost. Nearby is the **Dormition Abbey** believed to be the home of the Virgin Marv after the crucifixion until her eternal sleep. On to visit St. Peter in Gallicantu Church.

Overnight – Herbert Samuel Hotel, Jerusalem. B

Friday, March 3 - Masada and the Dead Sea Area

Drive east through the Judean Desert to **Qumran**, an ancient desert village where the Essenes lived 2000 years ago and where the Dead Sea Scrolls were discovered. Continue to the oasis of **Ein Gedi** where young David spared King Saul's life. Stop at a hotel on the shore of the **Dead Sea** for a buffet lunch and use of the hotel's private Dead Sea beach, private indoor and outdoor pools. After a swim, proceed to the clifftop fortress of **Masada** and ascend via cable-car. Return to Jerusalem.

Overnight – Herbert Samuel Hotel, Jerusalem. B, L, Shabbat Dinner at the hotel

Saturday, March 4 - Bethlehem

Pass through the checkpoint between Israel and Palestinian territories into **Bethlehem** to meet our Palestinian guide and representatives from **Wi'am**, a group seeking justice and reconciliation. Visit the **Walled Off Hotel** and see **wall art by Banksy**. Tour **Tent of Nations**, a family-owned farm that brings diverse groups people together to learn, share, and build bridges of understanding and hope (*pending confirmation*).

Sunday, March 5 - The New City of Jerusalem and Bethlehem

Begin the day at Yad Vashem, the central memorial dedicated to the Holocaust. Then return to Bethlehem to tour Manger Square and see the Church of the Nativity, built over the site where Jesus was born. See Shepherds Field, the site the angel visited the Shepherds with the news of Jesus' birth.

Monday, March 6 - Follow the Bible and Connect the Dots

Check out of the hotel and begin the day at **Mount Moriah** (*Temple Mount*), where it is said Abraham was ready to sacrifice his son, and on which stands the **Dome of the Rock** with its multi-colored mosaics and Golden Cupola. Tradition has it that this rock marks the center of the earth for the Jewish religion. Muslim tradition cites this as the place from which Mohammed ascended to heaven. It is the third holiest place on earth for Islam. In the same courtyard is the **EI Aksa Mosque** (*Access to Temple Mount area is pending police confirmation*.) Visit the **Israel Museum** housing archaeological and cultural treasures, and the **Shrine of the Book** that houses the **Dead Sea Scrolls**. Visit the model of ancient Jerusalem. Have lunch at **Mahane Yehuda**, the open air market of Jerusalem. Travel into the Judean Hills to the top of **Tel Azeka** in the Elah Valley, the site of the battle between "David and Goliath." Drive to the beach for a **Farewell Dinner** before transferring to Ben Gurion Airport for your departure flight. Our tour agency will assist with departure procedures. **B, D**
